Typhoon Gaemi Devastates the Indo-Pacific

The Chinese official Xinhua news agency reported, that more than 27,000 people were evacuated in northeast China and hundreds of factories were ordered to suspend production as Typhoon Gaemi brought heavy rains. The news agency also reported, the storm killed dozens as it swept through Taiwan and worsened seasonal rains in the Philippines. Hundreds of mining and chemical companies across the Liaoning province have suspended operations and nearby residents have relocated.

US Lawmaker: China making inroads into key chokepoints in Indian Ocean

It is now established that China is making inroads into key choke points across the Indian Ocean, posing a threat to the economic interests and national security and hindering free maritime passage of both the US and its allies in South Asia. Congresswoman Young Kim, who is the chairperson of the subcommittee on Indo-Pacific, also said, "We cannot forget the significance of Indo in the Indo-Pacific". She also added South Asian region holds "immense significance" for the US national security interests and foreign policy, and how the region faces a geopolitical landscape that presents challenges for the US policy objectives.
