India's Submarine INS VAGIR en route Australia

The Indian Navy's *INS Vagir* marks a landmark milestone as it will reach Fremantle as part of the extended range deployment to Australia for the first time. This strategic deployment follows the deployment of IAF C-130 and Indian Navy Dornier maritime patrol aircraft to the Cocos Islands. These islands are positioned in proximity to Indonesia and in the Southern Indian Ocean, hence, are pivotal for maritime routes in the IOR. Therefore, this deployment marks a strategic leap for India's influence in the IOR and enhances India's commitment to secure international maritime cooperation and to secure vital sea routes.
