Australia to Host the Malabar Exercise

The 31st edition of the Malabar Exercise is being held off the east coast of Australia for the first-time. Indian Navy has deployed frigate *INS Sahyadri* and destroyer *INS Kolkata* for the naval exercise. During the ten-day (august 11-21) exercise the four participating navies will test their interoperability in the East Australia Exercise Areas.
